Scholarship Opportunities Doubles for January Test Takers

All the students who secure LSAT-India Test score above 80 percentile score up to 99.99 or 100 percentile are eligible to receive scholarships ranging from 10%, 25%, 50% and up to 75% of tuition fees. Those who take the January Test have an opportunity to improve their score in the May Test and qualify in a higher scholarship range. The higher of the two scores is considered for a scholarship award if a student writes both January & May Tests. The University has revised the annual parental limit to INR 50 lakhs this year as eligibility to apply for scholarships.

One Test for Multiple Law Programmes

LSAT-India Test is accepted for One Year LLM as well as 3-year BA degree programs of Jindal Global Law School. This is also accepted by various other law schools in the country. "One entrance exam actually opens doors for multiple institutions and programs."
