

CLAT 2023 in 7 Months! Should You Take a Drop?

If it's a college in the likes of Symbiosis, Christ or Jindal. Take it! Perhaps in 3 months you love the college you're in and don't see the point in writing CLAT again, or if you don't clear CLAT 2023, you have a backup option.
