CLAT v. AILET: Should You Prepare for Both?

One major difference is the number of questions. AILET asks more questions in a shorter duration, making time management more crucial. The syllabus for both exams is largely similar but AILET tends to have a slightly more difficult English section and includes more challenging logical reasoning questions.

Should You Prepare for Both CLAT and AILET?

The decision to prepare for both CLAT and AILET depends on several factors:

- If your goal is to secure a seat at NLU Delhi, it makes sense to prepare for AILET alongside CLAT. However, if you're open to other top NLUs, focusing solely on CLAT could be a more practical approach.

- If you've practiced mocks for both exams and are equally confident in the subjects tested, preparing for both may be worthwhile. However, if you find a noticeable difference in your performance between the two, it may be best to focus on the exam you're more comfortable with.
