

How to Prepare for CLAT in 4 Months?

The CLAT 2022 exam will be held on May 8, 2022. You must be astute while developing a study plan for the Common Law Admission Test, since all topics are important in qualifying for the test. If you're wondering how to prepare for CLAT with just 4 months to go, this article is for you.

Follow all of the recommendations in the article below and create the finest study strategy to help you succeed in the forthcoming test!

What Should I Include in My CLAT Study Plan for 2022?

To begin, keep in mind that a study schedule does not imply that you must study 24 hours a day, seven days a week. It is important to relax and take pauses. Along with mastering the curriculum, additional components of preparation such as review, practising CLAT Question Papers, and taking mock exams should be taken into account while developing a study strategy.

Following this method detailed below will definitely aid in qualifying the exam on the first try.

How to Prepare for CLAT:

1st Month of CLAT Preparation:

Study Math, Verbal and Logical Reasoning, and English.

Before commencing CLAT preparation, it is critical to familiarise yourself with the complete test structure and the important CLAT subjects. Begin by learning concepts from Math, Verbal, and Reasoning, and English one at a time, and be sure to read an English newspaper on a regular basis.

Ensure that you finish as many subjects as possible without fail in this section within a month. Make a list of key phrases from each subject so that you can refer to it throughout the revision phase. Ensure that you study concepts and issues from GK and Legal Aptitude within the first month.

2nd Month of CLAT Preparation:

Study General Knowledge and Legal Aptitude.

List the topics in each discipline where you are confident or apprehensive. Begin by designating different periods for GK and Legal Aptitude. Acquire a solid understanding of judgments and amendments, since the majority of the questions are directly based on law.

1. Revise every 15 days to help you recall what you've learned.
2. In a week, try to complete at least two previous year's papers.

3rd Month:

Begin Revision and Solve Question Papers.

This month is totally dedicated to solving question papers and reviewing all subjects.

1. Try not to read anything new at this time. This might lead to misunderstanding and the forgetting of crucial information.
2. Attempt to approach each question paper as if it were an exam.

4th Month:

Mock Tests.

Practice as many questions as possible from previous year's papers. Attempt at least one CLAT Mock Test every day and review subjects at the same time to help you analyse your preparation levels. Try to improvise on issues where you are weak.

What is the Section Wise CLAT Study Plan 2022?

Many of you may have questions about subject-specific preparation, such as what subjects are important, what should be concentrated on more, and so on. So, read through the subject-wise study strategy from the article below to improve your preparation for the upcoming CLAT examination.

CLAT English CLAT Study Plan

There will be 28-32 questions in the English portion. This part mostly assesses your knowledge of Vocabulary and Grammar. Practice is the only way to master the English language section. To

increase your vocabulary, read and re-read. Be an avid reader. Read anything you can get your hands on.

1. Improve your grammatical skills. A solid grammar score implies a good English section result.
2. Try to learn at least 5-10 new terms every day and utilise them in your regular life.
3. Understand how the words are used in sentences.
4. Improve your vocabulary by reading newspaper and editorial articles.

CLAT Study Plan for General Knowledge

Sports, History, Art & Culture, Economics, and Government Policy, Books, Geography, Awards, National & International Events, Organizations, and People are among the subjects covered in the GK section.

1. Make it a point to read the newspaper every day.
2. Major newspapers and monthly magazines are best for current events.
3. Ensure that you have a solid understanding of what is going on in the nation. Also, keep up with current events by watching the news on a daily basis.

CLAT Math Study Plan

You don't have to be a math whiz to crack CLAT. You just need elementary and intermediate level maths to pass this test. The CLAT test will emphasise English, Legal Aptitude, and General Knowledge.

However, if you want to earn a decent rank, you must brush up on your math skills in order to do well in this segment, otherwise you will fall behind. Identify the key subjects and have a thorough comprehension of each issue.

Practising Previous Years Question Papers for CLAT

Practice prior years' question papers to get a sense of the kind of questions and the difficulty level. After completing each question paper, try to examine your performance and improve in weak areas.

CLAT Study Plan for Legal Aptitude

Legal aptitude remains the most essential element of the CLAT. Important book references for this would be the Indian Constitution and the Legal Penal Code. You may look for [books](#) on topics like “most widely used legal phrases” and “legal glossary terms.”

As a law student, you must be well-versed in the most regularly used legal phrases. Examine all of the judgments, statutes, amendments, and constitution provisions. Be aware of essential articles in the constitution, the IPC, legal know-how, prominent personalities in law, the right to information, and key articles, actions, and bye-laws from the viewpoint of the CLAT.

CLAT Study Plan for Logical Reasoning

This part mostly assesses your logical thinking and reasoning abilities. The majority of the problems include themes such as Critical and Verbal Reasoning, Analogies, Number Series, and Fact Inference Judgment.

As a result, you should set out at least one hour every day to prepare for all of these subjects. Also, answer puzzle-related questions and play logic-based games. This part will be easier to complete if you have a strong vocabulary. Try to discover the link between the two terms in the appropriate context.

Read the newspaper on a regular basis till the exam is concluded. Allow 1.5 to 2 hours every day to prepare for the quantitative aptitude portion. In a notepad, jot down all of the relevant formulae. Attempt at least one CLAT Mock Test every 4-5 days. Spend at least 2- 3 hours reviewing the performance of each mock exam once it has been completed.

Revise all of the subjects you prepared for that day at the end of the day. Attempt to answer analytical thinking, legal reasoning, and grammatical problems from various law admission tests such as the LSAT, AILET, SLAT, and so on.

1. To do well in the current events part, concentrate on the most relevant topics of the year.
2. Every day, answer 10-15 critical thinking problems and read 5 reading comprehension chapters. Follow Daily Current Affairs to prepare for the general knowledge part. This way, you can remain up to scratch on everything that is going on in the world.
