Answers

1. Correct Answer: B

The argument fundamentally fails by assuming logged attendance guarantees physical presence. Option B significantly weakens the argument by suggesting remote logging makes punctuality improvements superficial. Options A and C are irrelevant, addressing cost and an unrelated claim,

respectively. Option D strengthens the argument.

2. Correct Answer: A

The north and south movements cancel each other. Only 5 km east remains.

3. Correct Answer: A

The fundamental premise is that without the assumption of advertisements influencing children, a ban on them would be ineffective, which supports option A as the correct choice. Option B is a statement of fact but is not critical to the argument. Option C deflects accountability away from the advertisements themselves. Option D is irrelevant to the discussion about advertising.

4. Correct Answer: A

Each letter is shifted one step forward:

B→C, O→P, O→P, K→L, making it CPPL.

5. Correct Answer: B

Mental health improvement is directly supported by reducing stress and anxiety, which aligns with option B. Options A, C, and D do not substantiate the claim regarding mental health.

6. Correct Answer: C

Each initial term is multiplied by 2 ($2 \times 2 = 4$, $4 \times 2 = 8$, $8 \times 2 = 16$ and $16 \times 2 = 32$).

7. Correct Answer: B

The decrease in incidents logically points to the efficacy of helmets, making option B the correct choice. Options A and D are overly definitive, and option C lacks direct substantiation from the provided information.

8. Correct Answer: B

Given that S is at the extreme left, the arrangement starts with S in the first position. We are informed that P is to the left of Q, and R is to the right of Q. Consequently, Q must occupy the position between P and R. When arranging the individuals from left to right, respecting all stated conditions, the sequence is:

S, P, **Q**, R, T

In this configuration, Q is precisely in the middle, holding the third position. Therefore, Q sits in the middle.

9. Correct Answer: C

The conclusion, which is the policy recommendation, is represented by option C. The other

options serve as supporting premises.

10. Correct Answer: B

An eye enables vision; similarly, an ear enables hearing.

11. Correct Answer: A

Increased school hours are assumed to improve performance, equating more time with better learning. However, Option A's point on fatigue invalidates this. Longer days reduce concentration and retention, negating the link between extended time and improved results. Other options are irrelevant as they don't challenge the core premise that longer hours lead to superior performance.

12. Correct Answer: A

East and west cancel out; only 2 km south remains.

13. Correct Answer: A

The argument relies on past practice rather than logic.

14. Correct Answer: D

Rose, lotus, and lily are flowers; mango is a fruit.

15. Correct Answer: B

Since S is at an extreme end, place S at the left end. Q is second to the left of S, which is not possible if S is on the left, so S must be on the right end. Placing S at the rightmost position, Q is two places to its left. T sits immediately to the left of Q. R must be immediately to the left of P. After placing S, Q, and T, the only way to keep R and P together is R followed by P. The remaining position is filled by U.

Thus, the final arrangement from left to right is:

S - T - Q - R - P - U (Option B)
