Answers

1. Correct Answer: B - The argument assumes that crime mainly happens on streets where lighting matters. If many crimes occur indoors, increasing streetlights will not significantly reduce crime. The other options only discuss cost or availability and do not challenge the link between streetlights and crime.
2. Correct Answer: A - The movement north and south cancels each other out. Only the 5 km movement toward the east remains. Therefore, the person is 5 km away from the starting point.
3. Correct Answer: A - The statement clearly says that students who practice regularly perform well. Since Riya practices regularly, it logically follows that she will perform well in exams. The other options introduce ideas that are not mentioned in the statement.
4. Correct Answer: B - In the coding pattern, each letter is shifted one position forward in the alphabet. For example, L becomes M and I becomes J. Applying the same pattern, D becomes E, A becomes B, R becomes S, and K becomes L, giving the correct coded word.
5. Correct Answer: B - The claim is about improving air quality. Trees absorbing carbon dioxide and releasing oxygen directly improves air quality, so this strongly supports the argument. The other options describe benefits of trees but do not relate directly to air quality.
6. Correct Answer: B - The differences between the numbers are increasing by 2 each time. The pattern is +4, +6, +8, and the next increase is +10. Adding 10 to 23 gives 33.
7. Correct Answer: A - Stricter fines likely discouraged drivers from violating rules, which suggests they became more careful. The other options introduce explanations that are not mentioned or supported by the information given.
8. Correct Answer: B - The only arrangement that satisfies all conditions is P - S - Q - R. Therefore, S occupies the second position from the left.
9. Correct Answer: C - The statement clearly says that all roses belong to the category of flowers. However, it does not provide enough information to say whether roses fade quickly or not.
10. Correct Answer: A - A pen is used for writing. Similarly, a knife is used for cutting.
11. Correct Answer: B - If many people prefer cars, fewer people may switch to bicycles. This weakens the claim that bicycles will significantly reduce pollution. The other options do not challenge the pollution argument.

12. Correct Answer: A – The west and east movements cancel each other out. The only remaining movement is 4 km toward the north.
13. Correct Answer: A – The argument assumes that something is correct simply because it has existed for a long time. Longevity does not necessarily prove effectiveness.
14. Correct Answer: C – Cow is a herbivore while the others are carnivores or omnivores.
15. Correct Answer: B – Online classes make it easier for students to attend because they do not need to travel. This directly explains the increase in attendance. The other options are assumptions that are not supported by the information given.
