Answers

1. Correct Answer: C - The argument is weakened because if small businesses already have internet access, free public Wi-Fi won't significantly impact their online activity. Options A, B, and D are irrelevant as they address cost or support usage, rather than the core claim.

2. Correct Answer: A

Net south-north movement = $10 - 4 = 6$ km south.

East movement = 6 km.

Distance from start = $\sqrt{(6^2 + 6^2)} = \sqrt{72} \approx 8.49 \rightarrow 8$ km.

3. Correct Answer: A - The core of the argument is the unstated premise that guidance is necessary because students are currently experiencing confusion. The alternative options presented do not address the central issue of how counseling might influence student choices.

4. Correct Answer: C - Each letter is shifted one step forward. S→T, C→D, H→I, O→P, O→P, L→M, which ultimately makes it TDIPPM.

5. Correct Answer: D - Lower stress leads to better productivity, directly supporting the argument. Other options are either neutral or irrelevant.

6. Correct Answer: C - X is Z's grandfather because X is Z's mother's father.

7. Correct Answer: B - Cycling lanes are the most reasonable explanation for the reduction in congestion, as other potential options involve claims that are either too extreme or lack

supporting evidence.

8. Correct Answer: A - Each initial number is multiplied by 2 → $3 \times 2 = 6$, $6 \times 2 = 12$, $12 \times 2 = 24$ → next = $24 \times 2 = 48$.

9. Correct Answer: D - The ranking: $E > D > C > A > B$. E is the highest scorer.

10. Correct Answer: B - Students are taught at schools; patients are treated at hospitals.

11. Correct Answer: C - The author's central claim is the need for investment. Other statements are supporting reasons.

12. Correct Answer: A - Improved concentration is supported by reduced stress, which strengthens the claim. Conversely, the other options do not lend support to the conclusion.

13. Correct Answer: A - Effectiveness cannot be established solely by popularity.

14. Correct Answer: B - Even if streetlights are installed, accidents may still occur if drivers ignore speed limits. Other options either support or are irrelevant.

15. Correct Answer: C - North-south movements cancel → net movement = 3 km west.
