Answers

1. Correct Answer: C

The core assumption is that merely being physically present equates to actual participation. Option C challenges this by illustrating that attendance can be recorded even if meaningful engagement is absent. Option A concerns the cost, not the effectiveness, of the measure. Option B contains a factual error regarding biometric systems. Option D is irrelevant to the argument's central causal claim.

2. Correct Answer: B

North and south movements cancel each other. Only 8 km east remains.

3. Correct Answer: B

Online courses alone do not guarantee improved employability; this requires both completion and dedicated effort, making option B the correct assumption. Options A, C, and D have no direct impact on the effectiveness of the learning itself.

4. Correct Answer: A

Each letter is shifted one step forward.

P→Q, L→M, A→B, N→O, E→F gives QMBOF.

5. Correct Answer: C

Option C is the most relevant because it establishes a direct connection between reducing meeting duration and improving efficiency. The remaining options are either subjective opinions

or not pertinent to the discussion.

6. Correct Answer: B

Pattern = initial number $\times 2 + 1$

$$47 \times 2 + 1 = 95$$

7. Correct Answer: B

The most logical conclusion is that helmets decrease the number of fatalities, which establishes option B as the correct choice. The remaining options are either too strong or lack supporting evidence.

8. Correct Answer: A

Arrangement: D - C - B - A - E

Hence, B occupies the middle position.

9. Correct Answer: C

The core argument establishes air pollution as the cause of health problems. Therefore, the logical inference is a policy recommendation directed at the source, the reduction of air pollution (Option C). Options A and B are only factual statements or contextual details. Option D is irrelevant as it does not address the prevention of the established cause.

10. Correct Answer: C

A teacher works in a school; similarly, a doctor works in a hospital.

11. Correct Answer: A

Option A is the correct choice because it highlights that eye strain can diminish study time and concentration, thereby reducing the effectiveness of learning. The other options are either supportive of the learning benefits or not relevant to the main point.

12. Correct Answer: A

West and east cancel out; only 4 km north remains.

13. Correct Answer: A

The statement assumes that just because something is popular, it must be correct. This is a logical flaw called appeal to popularity. The other options do not describe this kind of reasoning error, so they are incorrect.

14. Correct Answer: D

The first three are shapes; red is a colour.

15. Correct Answer: B

Reducing travel time directly boosts productivity. The alternative explanations fail to account for the increased efficiency.
