Answers with their Explanations

1. Correct Answer: C

Option A concerns not the pollution impact, its affordability.

Option B is factually mistaken and even unnecessary.

Option D is future speculation.

Hence, Option C has to hold because in this way, the replacement of vehicles will be meaningless in terms of the reduction of pollution.

1. Correct Answer: B

Options A and D overgeneralise.

Option C is an introduction of the absolute that is not provided.

Hence, Option B is correct in her statement of possibility that is the best valid conclusion.

1. Correct Answer: B

Options A and D are descriptive, not supportive.

Option C is a general value statement.

Hence, Option B, by presenting data, thus strengthens the argument.

1. Correct Answer: B Option A contradicts the premise. Option C is unsupported. Option D is illogical. Hence, Option B has been used to explain the continuation of outbreaks.
1. Correct Answer: B Options A, C and D are claims without foundation. Hence, Option B can be called a valid conclusion as it shows a logical overlap.
1. Correct Answer: C Pattern: the earlier number $\times 2 + 1 =$ the next number in pattern $4 \times 2 + 1 = 9$ $9 \times 2 + 1 = 19$ $19 \times 2 + 1 = 39$ $39 \times 2 + 1 = 79$ So, the next number in the pattern is 79 (Option C).
1. Correct Answer: A X is the child of Z's brother. So, X is the niece of Z.
1. Correct Answer: D Options A, B, and C are premises. Hence, Option D is the author's conclusion.
2. Correct Answer: A FIR initiates the process, judge presides over the trial, leading to a verdict.
1. Correct Answer: A Option B supports environmental reasons, not job creation. Option C is irrelevant. Option D is technical feasibility, not related to jobs. Hence, Option A directly strengthens the employment argument.
2. Correct Answer: B The argument assumes that more parks will lead to more exercise, which would ultimately lead to better health. Option A supports the idea of parks being useful. Option C supports the link between exercise and health. Option D talks about land availability, not whether parks improve health. Hence, Option B weakens the argument because if people do not actually exercise in parks, building more parks will not improve health.
3. Correct Answer: B Option A is too obvious; literacy depends on more than just ability. Option C is too strong; literacy has multiple factors. Option D is irrelevant. Hence, Option B is necessary; without learning materials, internet access won't help.
4. Correct Answer: B This allows possible overlap, not certainty. Option A is incorrect because there is no statement saying all lawyers are professors. Option C is incorrect because overlap is possible and not ruled out. Option D is incorrect because law professors need not be public prosecutors. Hence, Option B is correct because some public prosecutors may also be law professors.
5. Correct Answer: B Option A is too strong; multiple factors may affect air quality. Option C is speculative and unsupported. Option D is irrelevant. Option B is a cautious and reasonable inference.

6. Correct Answer: D Each letter shifted +1 in alphabet. J becomes K, U becomes V, D becomes E, G becomes H and E becomes F. Making it KVEHF (Option D).
