### B. National & Legal News

- Focus on Supreme Court and High Court judgments.
- Read about new bills, laws, and constitutional amendments.
- Follow legal developments (e.g., right to privacy, same-sex marriage ruling, citizenship laws, etc.).

### C. International Affairs

- Prioritize India's relations with neighboring countries.

- There are important treaties and international organizations, such as the UN, WTO, and ICJ.
- Legal disputes involving India in international forums.
- UN resolutions and their impact on India.

#### **How to read?**

- Identify India's stance on global issues.
- Note down important agreements and their impact.
- Focus on legal principles governing international relations (e.g., Vienna Convention).

### **D. Science, Technology, and Environment (Selective Reading)**

- Important rulings of the Supreme Court on environmental laws.
- Space missions, medical breakthroughs, and AI regulations.
- Issues related to climate change and sustainable development.

### **A. The 3-Level Note-Making Strategy**

1. Daily Notes: Summarize articles into 3–4 bullet points.
2. Weekly Review: Revise and categorize topics under legal, economy, international, etc.
3. Monthly Compilation: Create a one-page summary of key events.

### **B. Mnemonics & Visualization Techniques**

- Convert information into stories or acronyms.
- Example: For important Supreme Court cases, create a mind map of case facts, ruling, and impact.

### **C. Teach Someone or Speak Out Loud**

- Explaining news to a friend significantly improves recalling abilities.
- If alone, record a 2-minute explanation on your phone.
