PASSAGE

General defenses under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) provide legal justifications or excuses for individuals accused of committing certain offenses. These defenses aim to balance the need for holding individuals accountable for their actions while recognizing exceptional circumstances that may warrant a different legal outcome.

The general defenses include consent, accident, necessity, mistake of fact, self-defense, private defense, insanity, and infancy. Consent refers to situations where a person willingly agrees to the act or harm caused. Accident covers instances where an act was unintentional or an unforeseen consequence occurred.

Necessity arises when an individual commits an offense to prevent greater harm or danger. Mistake of fact occurs when an individual commits an act under a genuine misunderstanding or misinterpretation of facts. Self-defense and private defense allow individuals to protect themselves or others from imminent harm or unlawful aggression.

Insanity provides a defense when the accused was mentally incapable of understanding the nature and consequences of their actions. Lastly, infancy recognizes that children below a certain age lack the mental capacity to form criminal intent. These general defenses play a vital role in the criminal justice system by ensuring fairness and considering the unique circumstances surrounding each case.
