Explanation: if you have a quick reading of the complete passage you will understand that the passage is talking about transactions between India and US and option b will only suit best in giving a logical meaning to the sentence.

1. (a) relationship (b) struggle (c) matter (d) talks

Ans. (a)

Explanation: by interlinking the sentences and applying eliminating method the logical meaning of the sentence is achieved only by using option a.

1. (a) formed (b) eclipsed (c) floated (d) ruined

Ans. (c)

Explanation: now if you carefully read the sentence, it uses the word 'cloud' before the blank. So on a perusal of options, we can come to the conclusion that the word 'float' can only give the sentence meaning as clouds can float but they can't be eclipsed, ruined or formed.

1. (a) generously (b) grudgingly (c) gracefully (d) willingly

Ans. (b)

Explanation: the tone of the sentences is negative and the options other than (b) are positive in meaning and only option (b) is giving a meaning to the sentence in connection with others.

1. (a) threats (b) creations (c) properties (d) monopoly

Ans. (d)

Explanation: option d only gives the meaning to the sentence in light of the passage. Other options are not providing a logical meaning.

1. (a) prepared (b) objecting (c) pointing (d) clinging

Ans. (b)

Explanation: by applying the elimination you will be left only with option c and b. But if you connect the sentences you will realise according to the tone of passage option b will only give the requisite meaning.

Explanation: again if you will put each option in the sentence only option d will give meaning in the light of the entire passage to the sentence.

Explanation: the sentence preceding the blank is in the third person thus 'their' will be used.

Explanation: option c only gives the meaning to the sentence.

Explanation: the meaning of the sentence in the light of the passage can be achieved only through option c.

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
