The debate around the SilverLine, the proposed semi high-speed railway in Kerala, has reached a blind alley. If the project, funded partly by the State government, comes through, the 530-kilometre distance between Kerala's l [1] and its northern-most district [2] could be covered in less than four hours. This journey takes at least 12 hours now. But many critics of the new railway question the very idea of high-speed travel in Kerala, arguing that there would not be enough riders.

The State Government, for its part, is yet to convince the people that the railway line can be a catalyst for a progressive transformation of Kerala's economy. It may be useful for Kerala to go over the experience of Japan in building the world's first ever high-speed rail line, called the Shinkansen. In the 1950s, there were serious doubts about its viability, in a country that had been devastated by the Second World War. However, ever since its inauguration in 1964, Shinkansen has been a powerful agent and a symbol of Japan' s economic resurgence.
