1. Correct Answer: A - The National Statistical Office (NSO), which operates under the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI), releases the First Advance Estimates. These estimates provide an initial indication of the country's economic growth.

2. Correct Answer: D - In January 2026, Hungary assumed the rotating presidency of the EU Council, where it established legislative priorities.

3. Correct Answer: B - In January 2026, ISRO focused on critical testing for the Gaganyaan human spaceflight mission, including parachute system validation. The uncrewed Gaganyaan-1, carrying the Vyommitra robot, is scheduled for early 2026, advancing India's first crewed Low Earth Orbit mission.

4. Correct Answer: C - A dedicated Climate Action Cell was established in Tamil Nadu to strengthen its climate governance framework.

5. Correct Answer: A - AI-driven cyber threats were identified as a major short-term risk during the Global Risks discussions at Davos.

7. Correct Answer: B - As a nuclear confidence-building measure, India and Pakistan have an agreement to exchange lists of their nuclear installations. This agreement, originally signed on December 31, 1988, and which became effective in 1991, saw its 35th such exchange on January 1, 2026.

8. Correct Answer: B - India launched its first indigenous Pollution Control Vessel, the 'Samudra Pratap,' in January 2026. Designed to combat oil spills and chemical pollution, its deployment

boosts India's environmental protection, coastal security, maritime law enforcement in its Exclusive Economic Zone, and search and rescue capabilities.

15. Correct Answer: D - Inaugurated in January 2026, India's Smart Green Aquaculture Institute utilizes advanced Recirculating Aquaculture System (RAS) technology. This enables year-round, tropical farming of high-value cold-water species like rainbow trout by continuously treating and reusing water for precise control over quality, temperature, and biosecurity.
