3. D – The 2026 FIFA World Cup will be jointly hosted by three nations in North America: Canada, Mexico, and the United States. This marks the first time three nations have co-hosted the tournament, which will feature an expanded 48-team format across 16 cities, with the majority of matches (60) held in the USA.
4. B – During a “surgical” operation in Caracas in early January 2026, U.S. military forces captured Venezuela’s President Nicolás Maduro and his wife, Cilia Flores.
5. A – The operation, variously referred to as “Operation Resolve” or “Operation Absolute Resolve” culminated in the capture of Maduro and his wife by U.S. special forces, followed by their extradition to the United States.

7. B – The suspension of visa services by Bangladesh indicated a significant deterioration of diplomatic relations with India.
8. B – Bangladesh stressed the necessity of guaranteed player security and the preservation of national dignity as prerequisites for consenting to play matches in India.
9. D – Gig workers in India demanded better pay and safer working conditions, protesting against exploitative remuneration models.
10. C – Algorithmic bias is defined as the systematic, repeatable, and unfair errors within AI systems that result in discriminatory outcomes. This frequently disadvantages specific

individuals or groups. The root causes of this bias are typically found in biased training data, flawed design, or data that is skewed and unrepresentative.

B – The Seventh Session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-7), held in Nairobi in December 2025, focused on “Advancing sustainable solutions for a resilient planet” to tackle the triple planetary crisis of climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution. Key outcomes included 11 resolutions addressing plastics, AI, mineral management, and ecosystems.

14. A – From January 1, 2026, India has taken on the role of Chairperson for the Kimberley Process (KP). This marks the third time India has led this global initiative, which is dedicated to keeping “conflict diamonds” out of the legitimate, ethical diamond trade.
15. D – Dense fog blanketed Delhi on the first day of 2026, leading to ‘very poor’ air quality and reduced visibility. Data from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) showed the national capital’s average air quality index (AQI) was 372 at 8 am that day.
