Q. No.	Answer	Explanation
1	B	Venerated means “respected or praised deeply” – used to show admiration.
2	C	The subject is “Neither...nor,” which takes a singular verb – “was” is correct.
3	C	The statement contrasts digital tools with handwriting, suggesting handwriting has unique cognitive benefits.
4	B	Effect is a noun (the result), while affect is typically a verb. “Calming effect” is correct.
5	C	Installing surveillance implies the belief that being watched will discourage vandalism.
6	C	Words like “lacks feasibility” and “entanglements” suggest a critical view.

7	B	“Burning the midnight oil” means working late into the night.
8	D	The logical sequence introduces hydration, mentions its benefits and lack, and effects of dehydration.
9	B	The action happened before another past action — “had begun” is the past perfect tense.
10	C	Ephemeral means lasting a very short time – closest synonym is “fleeting.”
