Its key function is to produce comprehensive Assessment Reports that provide the scientific basis for international climate negotiations.
4. C – The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), established on April 1, 1935, and nationalized in 1949, functions as India's central bank. It is the primary institution responsible for regulating the nation's monetary policy. The RBI's key roles include managing the currency, operating the credit system, and ensuring price stability, all while promoting economic growth.
5. A – The main applications for Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellites are global communication, particularly for high-speed, low-latency internet services, and Earth observation.
6. D – Global South is an economic-political classification, not a geographic one.

8. C – A landlocked country is a sovereign nation without direct access to an ocean or open sea, as it is entirely enclosed by land. Consequently, it must depend on its neighbors for access to sea trade.

B – The 1944 Bretton Woods Conference was the catalyst for the establishment of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD), which is now integrated into the World Bank Group. These organizations were created with the twin goals of fostering global monetary cooperation and guaranteeing

financial stability, in addition to supporting post-war reconstruction efforts.
