Q. No.	Answer	Explanation
1	A. Sweden	Sweden officially joined NATO on March 7, 2024, becoming the alliance's 33rd member. Finland had joined earlier in April 2023.
2	C. Safeguard personal data and privacy	The DPDP Act, 2023 regulates personal data processing and strengthens digital privacy, modeled on global practices like GDPR.
3	B. NDA led by BJP	The BJP-led NDA retained power in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, securing a third consecutive term with reduced majority.
4	D. The Hague	The ICJ, the principal judicial organ of the United Nations, is located in The Hague, Netherlands.
5	C. Leh (Ladakh)	In August 2023, NTPC, in collaboration with MNRE, deployed five hydrogen fuel cell buses in Leh, Ladakh — the first commercial trial of hydrogen buses on public roads in India
6	A. Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh	The Ken-Betwa project is India's first river-linking initiative, involving MP and UP, aiming to address drought and irrigation issues.
7	B. Dr. Vandana Shiva	The Templeton Prize 2024 was awarded to environmentalist and author Dr. Vandana Shiva for her work on ecological sustainability and justice.
8	C. Kesavananda Bharati v. State of Kerala	In 1973, this landmark judgment gave rise to the Basic Structure Doctrine, limiting Parliament's amending powers under Article 368.
9	D. Gyanesh Kumar	As of May 2025, Gyanesh Kumar succeeded Rajiv Kumar and is the current Chief Election Commissioner of India.
10	B. India, USA, Japan, Australia	The Quad is a strategic dialogue between India, USA, Japan, and Australia aimed at promoting Indo-Pacific cooperation and security.
