Answers with Explanations

1. Correct Answer: 2

Increase by 10% $\rightarrow 40,000 \times 1.1 = 44,000$

Decrease by 10% $\rightarrow 44,000 \times 0.9 = \mathbf{39,600}$

1. Correct Answer: 1

Total parts = $3 + 5 = 8$

Each part = $240/8 = 30$

Boys = $3 \times 30 = \mathbf{90}$

1. Correct Answer: 3

Total marks = $5 \times 102 = 510$

Remaining marks = $510 - 110 = 400$

$$\text{Average} = 400/4 = \mathbf{100}$$

1. Correct Answer: 2

$$25\% \text{ of } 4000 = 1000 \text{ (discount offered)}$$

$$\text{Selling price} = 4000 - 1000 = \mathbf{\text{₹}3,000}$$

1. Correct Answer: 4

$$\text{Upstream speed} = 45/3 = 15 \text{ km/h}$$

$$\text{Downstream speed} = 45/2 = 22.5 \text{ km/h}$$

$$\text{Current speed} = (22.5 - 15) / 2 = \mathbf{3.75 \text{ km/h}}$$

1. Correct Answer: 3

$$\text{Spent} = 70\%, \text{ remaining} = 30\%$$

$$30\% = 9000 \rightarrow 100\% = 9000 / 30 \times 100 = \mathbf{\text{₹}30,000}$$

1. Correct Answer: 3

$$\text{Increase} = 50 \text{ (250-200)}$$

$$\text{Percentage} = (50/200) \times 100 = \mathbf{25\%}$$

1. Correct Answer: 3

$$\text{English} = 65/100 \times 100 = 65\%$$

$$\text{Mathematics} = (78/120) \times 100 = 65\%$$

1. Correct Answer: 2

$$\text{Original no. of workers} \times \text{Original no. of days} = \text{New no. of workers} \times \text{New no. of days}$$

$$8 \times 15 = 12 \times x$$

$$x = \mathbf{10 \text{ days}}$$

1. Correct Answer: 1

$$\text{Original total age} = 6 \times 30 = 180$$

$$\text{New total age} = 7 \times 32 = 224$$

Age of the 7th member = $224 - 180 = 44$ years

1. Correct Answer: 4

Side = $72 \div 4 = 18$

Area = $18^2 = 324$

1. Correct Answer: 2

Cost Price of 15 pens = Selling Price of 12 pens

Gain on 12 pens = Cost Price of 3

Gain% = $(3/12) \times 100 = 25\%$

1. Correct Answer: 2

Reduction of 20% in quantity of tablets means that 80% of tablets were actually purchased.

So, 80% of 4,000 = **3,200**

1. Correct Answer: 3

Total items = $4 + 3 + 5 = 12$

Neither law journal nor newspaper = only economics magazines = 3

Probability = $3/12 = \frac{1}{4}$

15. Correct Answer: 3

Percentage of students who failed = 25% = 15 (given)

Total strength of the class = 100% = $15 \times 100/25 = 15 \times 4 = 60$ students
