(C) According to Section 4 of the Water Act, the chairman of the State Board must be a person having special knowledge or practical experience in respect of matters relating to environmental protection or a person having knowledge and experience in administering institutions dealing with such matters
- 2. (D) As per Section 49 of the Act, cognizance of offences under the Act can be taken on a complaint made by either a Board or any officer authorised in this behalf by it or by any person who has given notice of not less than sixty days of the alleged offence and of his intention to make a complaint, to the Board or officer authorised.
- 3. (D) According to Section 43 of the Water Act.
- 4. (D) According to Section 2 (j) of the Act, the term “Stream” includes (i) river; (ii) water course (whether flowing or for the time being dry); (iii) inland water (whether natural or artificial); (iv) subterranean waters and (v) sea or tidal waters

5. (D) The Central Board does not have supervisory function and cannot issue legally binding directions, it can only coordinate and advise the State Boards.

(D) Section 2(e) of the Act, provides that “pollution” means such contamination of water or such alteration of the physical, chemical or biological properties of water or such discharge of any sewage or trade effluent or of any other liquid, gaseous or solid substance into water (whether directly or indirectly) as may, or is likely to, create a nuisance or render such water harmful or injurious to public health or safety, or to domestic, commercial, industrial, agricultural or other legitimate uses, or to the life and health of animals or plants or of aquatic organisms;
